Pediatric Course

Course Overview

The K-Taping® Pediatric course covers the basic functions and effects of K-Taping® with a focus on treatments for infants and children. Applications learned in the two-day course are for muscle, ligament, functional corrections, and fascia corrections. Lymphatic correction techniques are also introduced.

Participants will receive instruction on the application of techniques for multiple conditions including: poor posture and posture related damage; deformities of the feet; Plexus Palsies; Volkmann's Contracture; Arthrogryposis Multiplex Congenita; Cerebral Palsy; Spina Bifida and others.
